



Woodland Elementary School Dress Code

At Woodland Elementary, where we nurture future leaders, we believe appropriate appearance and attire are important. In order to do so, this policy is set forth by the school council for our students in order to promote learning, ensure safety and instill pride within themselves and as leaders of their school.

- Shirts and tops must have sleeves and cover midriffs, backs, shoulders, cleavage and undergarments.
- Sweatshirts and hoodies may be worn with hoods down while in the building.
- Jeans, khakis, overalls, leggings, capris, sweat pants, wind suits, and athletic pants/shorts or equivalent are acceptable and must be worn at the waistline (no sagging).
- Shorts, skirts, and/or dresses are to be worn no shorter than 5 inches above the knee (leggings, hose, or tights do not alter the required length).
- Holes, tears or fraying must be no higher than 5 inches above the knee.
- May not promote drugs, alcohol, cigarettes, violence, gangs or vulgarity.
- No inappropriate or suggestive wording or pictures.
- No pajamas or sleepwear except on specified spirit days.
- Hats are only acceptable on special days designated by the school.
- Shoes should have an enclosed toe and heel for students to participate in physical education and daily wellness activities. Tennis shoes are highly recommended.

Exceptions will be made for students with religious customs or for students with specific needs only after meeting with administration.

Any apparel or appearance (included but not limited to hair color/style, jewelry, makeup, etc.) that causes disruption to the instructional environment or is a safety concern will be responded to as deemed necessary. The administration has the final authority in determining appropriate school attire and appearance.
