- C. 5th graders have responded well to the Rocket Buck system. 5th graders are awarded "rocket bucks" each time they are kind or have great behavior then once a week, a cart that contains a variety of things goes around to each room and they can use their rocket bucks to purchase things off the cart.
- D. 3rd and 4th graders are motivated by S. Breeding's multiplication fact reward. If they can recite their multiplication facts from 1 -12 without missing any, they are awarded a movie theater size box of candy. S. Breeding reviewed percentages of mastery for the different classes.
- E. S. Breeding will review iReady results with teachers next week when testing is finished.

VIII. STAFFING

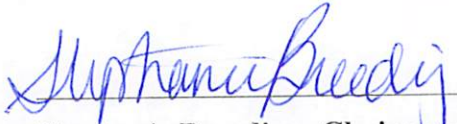
- A. Ashley Flowers was hired to be a 1:1 assistant. She went from a half time assistant to full time assistant.

She has been here to cover several of our maternity leaves that lasted 8 weeks each.
